Rockhampton Museum of Art is seeking First Nations' Artist Educators to deliver programs that complement our programming schedule and upcoming exhibitions from 2021 onwards. We are seeking First Nations Artist Educators to deliver a broad range of education programs that are directly or indirectly linked to art.

Overview of the First Nations' Artist Educator role

Rockhampton Museum of Art contracts a range of artist educators. They are key in the active delivery of engaging public programs at Rockhampton Museum of Art. We believe that First Nations Artist Educators are critical to reimagining the ways by which representations of First Nations peoples' and stories are shared at Rockhampton Museum of Art.

First Nations Artist Educators are essential in fostering creative learning and critical thinking in a safe and supported environment for First Nations and non Indigenous participants as well as through programs with combined audiences. They prioritise safe cultural protocols in the planning and delivery of programs and ensuring all materials and intellectual property have appropriate approvals by relevant persons and/or groups.

If you would like to be considered as a First Nations' Artist Educator with the Rockhampton Museum of Art, here are a few things you should know about your responsibilities:

- You are expected to have acquired and have proof of the necessary cultural authority and appropriate approvals to share any and all specific Indigenous knowledges (ie. use of specific stories, laws, languages) used in your sessions from owner and host Nations (Darumbal Peoples Aboriginal Corporation) prior to your commencement with the Rockhampton Museum of Art
- The learning program/workshop is primarily developed prior to commencement but that tailoring it to the Rockhampton Museum of Art will be paid and included in the agreement

Tasks and Responsibilities

First Nations' Artist Educators are responsible for developing and delivering the learning program (workshop, yarning/digital program). They also need to provide feedback to the Rockhampton Museum of Art on their learning programs and how they think the participation from the audiences went for them.

The learning programs may take place before, during or after opening hours. Programs may take place at offsite locations or at Rockhampton Museum of Art. Programs can range in length from short 30-minute sessions to longer form specialist masterclasses held over a weekend, weekly or an intensive full day event.

This position will work within Rockhampton Museum of Art engagement and learning team to deliver a variety of public programs, such as:

1. Adult workshops and Masterclasses
2. Evening events and performances
3. Holiday and after-school programs
4. Parties and celebratory events
5. Lectures and talks
6. Online content

Artist Educators can be both traditional and contemporary artists or arts workers, varying across creative fields (eg. academia, painting, sculpting, performing, crafting) – Artists Educators are enthusiastic about sharing their practice and knowledge.

Artist Educators will:

- Undertake the practical delivery of an allocated art program or event
- Set-up and clean-up workshop spaces before and after allocated program
- Follow existing Rockhampton Museum of Art work processes, procedures and systems
- Observe requirements of the WHS Legislation, relevant to the job and adhere to Rockhampton Regional Council Policies and Procedures regarding WHS
- Observe appropriate Rockhampton Regional Council Policies and Procedures regarding operations including Equal Employment Opportunity policies, Rockhampton Regional Council's Dress Code and Standards Policy and Rockhampton Regional Council's Code of Conduct.

Eligibility

- Applicants must have an ABN and hold Public Liability for \$10M
- Applicants must have or be willing to obtain appropriate Workplace Health and Safety and Public Liability Insurance (\$10M) to be eligible and will be required to provide all relevant tickets and licences.
- Applicant must have or be willing to obtain appropriate Blue Card qualifications

Hourly rate

Rockhampton Museum of Art is offering a contracted hourly rate of \$50.00 (or per experience). Work availability pending event type and demand.



Qualifications and Experience

- Experience delivering art workshops
- Certificate qualifications in Arts Education or related discipline, other relevant work experience
- Experience delivering similar programs in a Gallery/Museum environment is desirable

- Demonstrated ability to prioritise workload
